## Employment, Income & Poverty, 2006: Brunswick County

### Labor Force

- Brunswick County's labor force, including employed and unemployed workers seeking employment, totaled 45,420 in 2006.
- The county's labor force grew by 28.1% between 2000 and 2006.

### Unemployment

- Brunswick County's unemployment rate averaged 4.5% in 2006, compared to a statewide figure of 4.8%.
- Brunswick County's unemployment rate was lower in 2006 than it was in 2000.
- Some 2,064 people were unemployed and actively seeking work in Brunswick County in 2006, up from 1,614 people in 2000.

### Income & Poverty

- Median household income in Brunswick County equaled \$46,520 in 2006 – an amount equivalent to 109.1% of the statewide figure.
- The county's per capita income of \$23,980 was \$1,035 more than the statewide level.
- The county's poverty rate of 9.9% was lower than the statewide level of 14.7 percent.
- All together, 25.3% of the county's residents had incomes less than twice the federal poverty level (\$41,228 for a family of four).

### Job Projections

- The Brunswick County area is expected to add 54,136 jobs between 2004 and 2014.
- Most of the jobs expected to add the most positions (e.g. cashiers, retail salespersons) offer low wages, few benefits and little upward mobility.
- The jobs expected to grow the most in percentage terms, like those in health fields, typically pay good wages but require workers with some type of postsecondary credential.
- Some 71% of the county's adults possessed no more than a high school degree in 2005.

### Living Income Standard

- A working family with children needs to earn, on average, a total of \$17.34/hour to cover basic living expenses in Brunswick County.
