## 2022 Hoke County Debt-Based Driver's License Suspension Fact Sheet

In January 2022 Hoke County, NC had 11415 recorded cases with a guilty or responsible verdict and a court mandated fee. ${ }^{1}$ Of these, $55.8 \%$ of cases were in compliance and $44.2 \%$ of cases were in failure to comply (FTC) status. The majority of FTC cases were traffic violations.


## Defendant Statistics and Demographics

- 738 people had 2 or more traffic cases in FTC status.

- The majority of defendants with a traffic cases in FTC status were Black people (55\%). With Black men having the most traffic violation cases in FTC status.

- The majority of defendants with a traffic cases in FTC status were $21-30$ years old ( $44 \%$ ). ${ }^{2}$


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## Length in FTC Status

- $60.8 \%$ of cases were in compliance after 1 year of receiving FTC status.

- For all traffic cases in Hoke County in FTC status in January 2022, the average length in FTC was 14 years.
