Rural areas of NC have higher rates of drug and alcohol use, suicide, injury, teen births, and preventable hospitalizations<sup>1</sup>




Rural residents are more likely to be uninsured than urban residents<sup>3</sup>

#### **BACKGROUND:**

The General
Assembly's 2013
decision to REJECT
Medicaid Expansion
has jeopardized
rural hospitals and
denied coverage to
over 600,000 North
Carolinians, leading

to thousands of preventable deaths.

Thirty-three states including conservative ones like Virginia, Arkansas, and Indiana, expanded Medicaid to get more people coverage.



### **ECONOMIC IMPACT AND ACCESS TO HEALTH**

- Rural hospitals are 84% less likely to close if located in a state that expanded Medicaid<sup>5</sup>
- More than 13,000 jobs could be added to the 80 rural counties in NC if the General Assembly

#### expanded Medicaid<sup>6</sup>

- Rural residents benefit more from Medicaid expansion than urban residents<sup>5</sup>
- More jobs mean more economic activity which helps increase tax revenue and strengthen rural economies<sup>6</sup>
