### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 12,842 people looking for work compared to 14,904 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 4.9% to 4.6%.



### Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 51.1% of renters.

12.8% did not have health insurance.

There are 403 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

38.8% of residents are low-income (\$48,600 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 30 times greater than the poorest fifth and 7 times the typical household.
