### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 2,610 people looking for work compared to 849 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 6.3% to 5.7%.



### Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 55.6% of renters.

13.1% did not have health insurance.

There are 913 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

41.2% of residents are low-income (\$48,600 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 26 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
