### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 3,371 people looking for work compared to 2,286 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 5.5% to 5%.



### Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 54.1% of renters.

11.8% did not have health insurance.

There are 510 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

40.3% of residents are low-income (\$48,600 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 17 times greater than the poorest fifth and 5 times the typical household.
