### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 1,353 people looking for work compared to 283 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 5.2% to 4.8%.



### Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 48.8% of renters.

15.2% did not have health insurance.

There are 1,441 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

37.4% of residents are low-income (\$48,600 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 27 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
