### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 3,442 people looking for work compared to 1,598 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 7.4% to 6.4%.



### Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 53.4% of renters.

17.9% did not have health insurance.

There are 631 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

57.5% of residents are low-income (\$48,600 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 33 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
