### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 2,544 people looking for work compared to 1,696 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 7.6% to 6.8%.



### Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 53.0% of renters.

15.1% did not have health insurance.

There are 801 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

44.7% of residents are low-income (\$48,600 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 25 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
