- County Tier Status and Population: The county tier is determined by the NC Department of Commerce. The county population is estimated by the State Demographer Office, NC Office of State Budget & Management for July 2014 accessed here:

- Unemployment, Employment and Labor Force: These data points are taken from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (BLS), not seasonally adjusted for the noted time periods.
- **3. Poverty:** Poverty data is available for all 100 counties from the U.S. Census Bureau, Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates, 2013.
- Low-income population data is available for the state's larger counties as three-year averages from the U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey, 2011-2013
- 5. Median hourly wage and Living Income Standard: The median hourly wage data for each year is taken from the Occupational Employment Survey by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. - **6. Median household income** is from the U.S. Census Bureau, Small Area Income and Poverty Estimates, 2013.

- **9. Health insurance coverage:** Data is a three year average (2011-2013) for the largest counties from the U.S. Census Bureau.

- **12. Graduation rates**: This is the average for all groups based on a 4-year cohort and is from the N.C. Department of Public Instruction, 2013-2014 accessed at: http://www.ncpublicschools.org/docs/accountability/reporting/4yrcgrdisag13.xls
- **13. Graduation rates by race/ ethnicity:** This data is also from the N.C. - **14. Attainment of Higher Education Degrees:** This measure is of the population with a Bachelor's degree or higher and is based on a five-year average from 2009 to 2013 produced by the U.S. Census Bureau
