Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 50.6% of renters.

12.9% did not have health insurance.

There are 745 residents for every mental health provider.



Address Structural Barriers to Equality

40.3% of residents are low-income (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 23 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
