### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 1,495 people looking for work compared to 1,345 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 4.2% to 4.8%.



### Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 43.8% of renters.

12.2% did not have health insurance.

There are 675 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

31.5% of residents are low-income (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 24 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
