Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 46.2% of renters.

11.5% did not have health insurance.

There are 1,089 residents for every mental health provider.



Address Structural Barriers to Equality

38.7% of residents are low-income (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 20 times greater than the poorest fifth and 5 times the typical household.
