### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 380 people looking for work compared to 189 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 4% to 3.6%.



Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 50.7% of renters.

16.1% did not have health insurance.

There are 5,254 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

48% of residents are low-income (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 23 times greater than the poorest fifth and 5 times the typical household.
