### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 11,207 people looking for work compared to 18,897 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 4.3% to 3.9%.



### Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 50.7% of renters.

11.3% did not have health insurance.

There are 383 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

37.4% of residents are low-income (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 29 times greater than the poorest fifth and 7 times the typical household.
