### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 210 people looking for work compared to 66 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 10% to 9.1%.



Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 41.9% of renters.

13.5% did not have health insurance.

There are 5,363 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

43.6% of residents are lowincome (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 14 times greater than the poorest fifth and 4 times the typical household.
