### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 914 people looking for work compared to 1,094 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 4.2% to 4%.



Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 47.7% of renters.

13.8% did not have health insurance.

There are 222 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

39.8% of residents are lowincome (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 25 times greater than the poorest fifth and 5 times the typical household.
