### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 397 people looking for work compared to 162 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 3.7% to 3.4%.



### Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 49.9% of renters.

10.7% did not have health insurance.

There are 640 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

40.1% of residents are low-income (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 24 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
