Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 202,412 people looking for work compared to 302,886 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 4.3% to 3.7%.



Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 48.7% of renters.

12.1% did not have health insurance.

There are 439 residents for every mental health provider.



## Address Structural Barriers to Equality

36.5% of residents are lowincome (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 28 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
