Polk County has a population of 21,195, an increase of 4.5% over the past decade.

### Provide Jobs and Opportunities

There were 364 people looking for work compared to 241 job openings.

In the past year, the county's unemployment rate has gone from 3.8% to 3.7%.



Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 41.6% of renters.

12% did not have health insurance.

There are 541 residents for every mental health provider.



### Address Structural Barriers to Equality

31.7% of residents are lowincome (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 21 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
