Ensure Access to Affordable Housing and Health Services

Rent was unaffordable for 58.9% of renters.

14.1% did not have health insurance.

There are 679 residents for every mental health provider.



Address Structural Barriers to Equality

51.1% of residents are low-income (\$49,200 or less for a family of four).

The richest 5% of households have an average income 26 times greater than the poorest fifth and 6 times the typical household.
