Expand Access to Health Services

- 11.3% of people do not have health insurance.
- Life expectancy for white newborns is 77.4 years; life expectancy for Black newborns is 73.4 years.
- There is one mental health provider for every 1173 residents.



Provide Affordable Housing for All

- Rent is unaffordable for 52.1% of renters.
- 26.5% of people spend more than half of their income on rent.
- The median hourly wage is only 70.6% of what's needed for 1 adult and 2 children to make ends meet (LIS*).



Address Structural Barriers to Equality

- 31.6% of residents are considered low-income (less than \$50,200 for a family of four).**
- The richest 5% of households make an average of 30 times more than the poorest 20% of households.
