



Leandro v. State of NC

- ▶ Lawsuit filed in 1994 by five low-wealth school districts (Hoke, Halifax, Robeson, Vance and Cumberland)
- Suit claimed that districts did not have enough resources to provide an adequate education to their students
- NC Supreme Court ruled in 1997 and 2004 that the state's students have a constitutional right to an opportunity for a "sound, basic education" and that the state is not meeting that standard



Leandro v. State of NC

- November 2021 Judge Lee Orders Treasurer and Controller to release funding from state reserves to fund years 2 &3 of Comprehensive Remedial Plan
- December 2021 Court of Appeals overturns
 November ruling and blocks transfer of funds
- November 2022 North Carolina Supreme Court overturns Court of Appeals and orders the release of funding for years 2&3 of Leandro Plan



Excerpts from Justice Hudson's Landmark Ruling:

- "[F]ar too many North Carolina schoolchildren, especially those historically marginalized, are not afforded their constitutional right to the opportunity to a sound basic education. ... [T]he State has proven for an entire generation either unable or unwilling to fulfill its constitutional duty."
- Our Constitution is the supreme law of the land; it is not optional. ...




- ... For twenty-five years, the judiciary has deferred to the executive and legislative branches to implement a comprehensive solution to this ongoing constitutional violation. Today, that deference expires. ...
- ... Further deference on our part would constitute complicity in the violation, which this Court cannot accept. Indeed, ultimately '[i]t is the state judiciary that has the responsibility to protect the state constitutional rights of the citizens."

On Arguments Made by Legislative Intervenors:

These claims unequivocally fail. They are untimely, distortive, and meritless. At best, they reveal a fundamental misunderstanding of the history and present reality of this litigation. At worst, they suggest a desire for further obfuscation and recalcitrance in lieu of remedying this decades-old constitutional violation.
